**Present:** Cllrs C. Hamilton (Chair), M. Brown, T. Spong, G. Foster, K. Green, L. Fitzpatrick, D. Botterell, and J. Beady. Also, in attendance Mr K. Harkin (Parish Clerk) and eight members of public.

- 1. **Apologies:** None received.
- 2. **Minutes of the previous meeting**: The minutes of the meeting held on 19 April 2022 were proposed Cllr Botterell, seconded by Cllr Foster and agreed as a true record of proceedings.
- 3. **Declarations of Interest**: The Chair asked members present if they have any declarations to make. Cllr Fitzpatrick declared a non pecuniary interest in planning application 22/00727/TPO
- 4. **Clerk's Report**: The Clerk summarised his written report, which is attached as Appendix A.

It was agreed to site the recently purchase memorial bench on Loop Green overlooking the Christmas tree.

- 5. **Public Participation**:
  - A question "why not use the Council's reserves to complete the conversion of all the streetlights to energy efficient LED lanterns?" was asked. The Clerk explained that the Council has set aside a sum in it's 2022/23 budget to convert a percentage of the street lights maintaining its financial reserves within guideline limits.
  - The Clerk confirmed that TDC has written confirming payment of a Jubilee Grant but that the funding has yet to be received.
  - Concern was expressed by the stream of water running from a property on to the Clacton Road bypass. It was explained that Affinity Water inspected this recently and it has been suggested that the water emanates from an underground source, which was not apparent until a nearby willow tree was felled.
  - A complaint was made about the standard of the grass cutting of the verge on Clacton Road Bypass. It was agreed to write to Highways.
- 6. Tendring District and Essex County Councils: No reports received.
- 7. **Correspondence**: The Clerk notified members of the following;
  - <u>Wilder Towns, Wilder Villages</u>: It was agreed to include this as an agenda item for the 20 June meeting.
  - North Falls Offshore Wind Farm Newsletter: Noted.
  - <u>Mill Lane Care Home</u>: The noise complaint received was discussed. It was concluded that WPC is not in a position to act to resolve this matter.
  - <u>Estate Agent Board Complaint</u>: It was agreed that this is a commercial as opposed to residential marketing board and to notify the authorities.
- 8. **Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebration**: Cllr Hamilton provided an update on the arrangements for the Picnic in the Park event. It was noted that the Risk Assessment has yet to be finalised.

- Annual Parish Meeting (APM): The minutes of the APM held on 3 May 2022 were proposed by Cllr Botterell, seconded by Cllr Brown and agreed as an accurate record of proceedings.
- 10. Bus Shelter, Clacton Road, Weeley Heath: Cllr Spong reported that the roof of the bus shelter was made of asbestos sheets. Whilst they remain undamaged they do not pose an immediate health risk. After some discussion, Cllr Spong proposed, Cllr Hamilton seconded and it was RESOLVED: To seek funding from ECC (within a reasonable timescale) to replace the shelter. If funding is not available, WPC to obtain a quotation to replace the roof.
- 11. Avenue of Poplars on Weeley Bypass: The Clerk read out a proposal submitted by Mr Wolton to reduce the poplars and plant trees between them that will eventually replace these poplars. Councillors noted that this suggestion is broadly in line with WPC's proposals. The ultimate decision rests with ECC. A suggestion with made to approach The Woodland Trust for funding.
- 12. **Planning Applications**: The planning applications set out in Appendix B were considered by councillors.

#### 13. Weeley Parish Council Reports:

- a) <u>Street Lighting</u>: Cllr Green reported that streetlights 9061 and 9037 are out.
- b) <u>Tree Warden</u>: Nothing further to report.
- c) <u>Playing Field</u>: The Clerk confirmed that the football goalposts have now been relocated.
- d) <u>Children's Play Area</u>: Cllr Botterell reported that it is planned to schedule a meeting with a play company to discuss options.

#### 14. Other Reports:

- a) <u>Highways and Footpaths</u>: Cllr Beady presented her report, which is attached as Appendix C.
  - b) <u>TDALC</u>: There was no meeting last month.
- c) <u>Rural Policing</u>: 9 crimes were reported in Weeley and 21 in Little Clacton.
- d) <u>Speedwatch</u>: Cllr Beady reported that 130 speeding vehicles were logged during the past month. Seven of these had been logged previously and for one vehicle it was the 3rd time. Eight vehicles were untaxed and four had no MOT.
- e) <u>Weeley Residents Ass</u>. Nothing further to report since the APM.
- f) <u>Weeley in Bloom</u>: Nothing further to report since the APM.
- g) <u>Petanque Rink</u>: Nothing further to report since the APM.
- 15. **Finance and Budget**: The list of monthly payments were proposed by Cllr Hamilton, seconded by Cllr Spong and **RESOLVED**: To authorise the list set out in Appendix D for payment.
